

CANADA'S PROGRESS TOWARDS GLOBAL HIV TARGETS

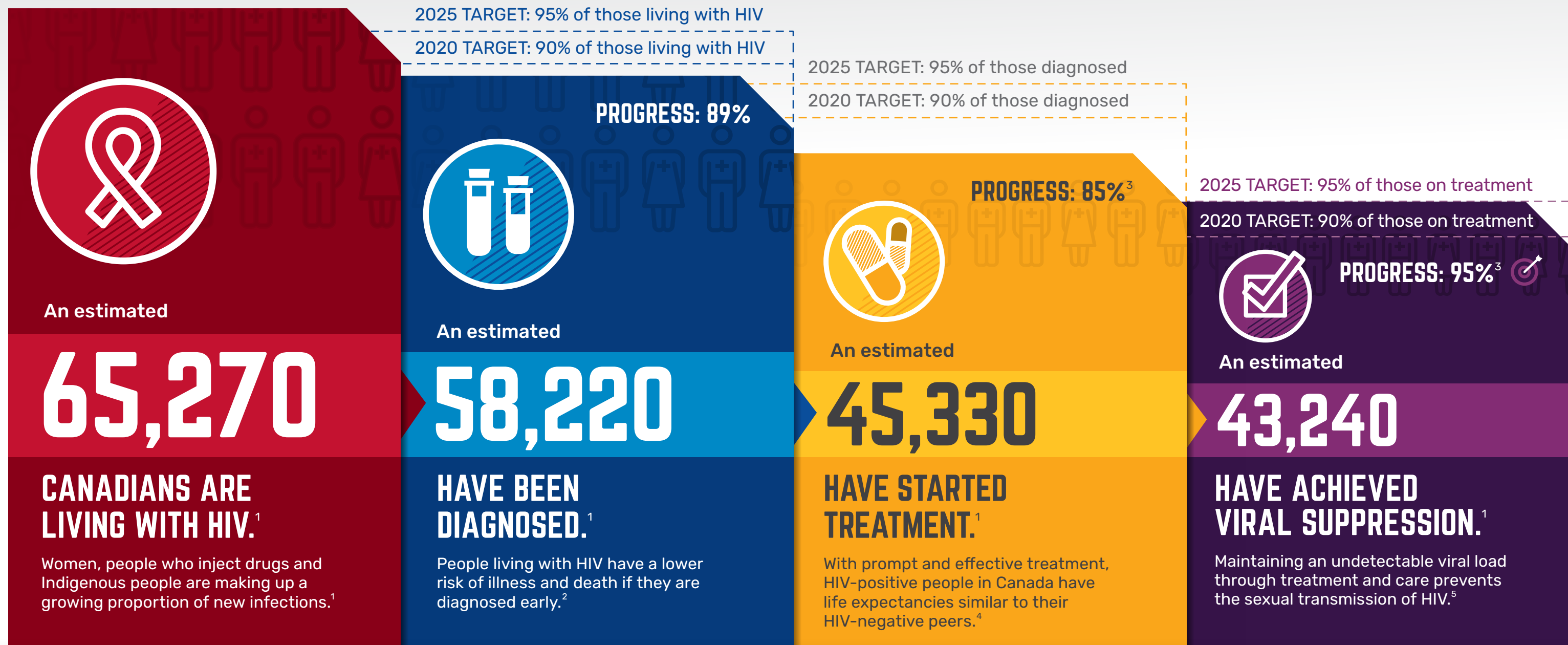
Canada has committed to meeting global targets for HIV testing and treatment.

Percent of people living with HIV diagnosed
90% by 2020 **95%** by 2025

Percent of people diagnosed starting treatment
90% by 2020 **95%** by 2025

Percent of people on treatment achieving viral suppression
90% by 2020 **95%** by 2025

It is projected that meeting these targets will end AIDS as a public health threat by 2030. This was the state of our progress at the end of 2022:
